Student Engagement

As students become increasingly aware of the power of exercising their rights, discussions about the First Amendment are particularly relevant. But what protections does the First Amendment really provide and how does it apply to contemporary issues? To address these important questions, F3 Law created this complimentary video, divided into three 15-minute parts, to be used as a resource in high school government and civics classes.

Evolving Laws

The video, entitled *Speaking of... Free Speech in a Changing Society*, touches on how the law is interpreted and applied through the court system and how the understanding of laws and rights evolves through judicial precedent, particularly as it pertains to freedom of speech. It discusses how the meaning of the First Amendment has been refined and adjusted through Supreme Court case law, and how new technology raises new questions.



This resource will be an aid to give our students a solid understanding of these five critical ingredients of civic education:

- Our democracy
- The U.S. Constitution and Bill of Rights
- Public participation in government
- Voting rules, both state and federal
- Media literacy
